**SUPPORT PROJECT IN QUALITY MANAGEMENT FOR
COCOA AND COFFEE PRODUCTION**

CONTEXT AND JUSTIFICATION

This project is part of a context marked by:

- The rejection of 4000 tons of cocoa at the gates of Amsterdam in December 2012 because of odour of smoke;
- Threat of backflow in case of detection of residues of polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs) or heavy metals (mercury, cadmium) in the beans;
- Recurrent bad practices of fermentation (in piles, in bags or not at all) and drying (on asphalt along the road);
- Certification of cocoa which comes into effect from 2020, from where the extreme urgency to anticipate on this deadline;
- The significant increase in cultivated areas due to the involvement of all sections of the population in the creation of new plantations (around 170 000 ha created since 2005);
- The implementation of a second-generation agriculture that should not tolerate amateurism in the cocoa / coffee sector;
- The discount of cocoa and coffee in 2015 worth 40 million



GLOBAL OBJECTIVE OF THE PROJECT

Contribute to the growth of domestic production of cocoa and quality coffees to ensure the sustainability of cocoa and coffee economies.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVE

- To accompany the producers in the control of the technical itinerary, guarantor of the quality and the international standards of certification of the cocoa and coffees;

- To accompany institutional actors in quality management in primary production of cocoa and coffee;
- To promote and reinforce pre-control and pre-differentiation of cocoa beans and coffee cherries grades before marketing.
- To institutionalize and put in place structures for monitoring operations in the primary production link



COMPONENTS

- Amelioration of Cocoa quality
- Amelioration of Arabica Coffee quality
- Amelioration of Robusta Coffee quality
- Coordination

EXPECTED RESULTS

- Capitalization of good agricultural practices and post-harvest operations by farmers and other actors in the primary sector ;
- Use of appropriate infrastructure and equipment for post-harvest treatment;
- Mastery of quality management of cocoa and coffee in the value chain;
- Generalization of the physical evaluation of cocoa beans and coffee cherries;
- Monitoring operations in the production basins.



ACTIVITIES

- Build the technical capacity of actors implicated in the quality management chain ;
- Build the operational capacities of farmers through the FFS approach ;
- Carryout scientific and technical studies in order to formulate technical norms and statutory disposition relative to technical itineraries and certified product ;
- Elaborate administrative and legislative dispositions relative to quality management in primary production;
- Support institutions in the control of product ;
- Support institutions in the monitoring of operations.

RESULTS OBTAINED SINCE JULY 2014

- **10 Supervisors trained in activity;**
- **136 facilitators trained in ICPM Farmer Field School (FFS) approach;**
- **839 FFS created;**
- **71484 cocoa and coffee farmers framed through the FFS approach;**
- **1575 samples taken for analysis.**
